



Pastor's Luis Corner "Transitions"

According to one dictionary; "Transition (as a noun means) movement, passage, or change from one position, state, stage, subject, concept, etc., to another; change: *the transition from adolescence to adulthood.*" The journey of a disciple of Christ is very similar to this definition. In his book, "Becoming an Adult, Becoming a Christian-Adult Development and Christian Faith" James W. Fowler gives us a very extensive detail of the meaning of transitions in our journey. Our behavior sometimes, most of the time, assumes the position that because we are all "adult or grow ups" we have a clear sense of where our faith is. Or another point of view is that we already have everything figured out and our faith is strong and solid so there is nothing else we must do. So, I wonder...!!!



Few years ago one of my lost friends found me on "Facebook" and invited me to be "friends" and to be part of the "gathering" of those who served as a counselor at the Youth Camp in Puerto Rico back in the 80's. Yes, I'm talking back about over 40 years ago. Well, on my friend's page I found a couple pictures of me from my early college years. Yes, I was in college by my 16th birthday. Sorry! 42 years later all of us have transitioned into "adulthood," (I only hope) but have we matured enough to be a mature Christian? In his book, Fowler (which I recommend that you read), shared how the stages of life are parallel to the stages in our journey in discipleship, becoming a mature Christian. Fowler said: "*This covenant relationship with God and others signifies the transition not simply to a self-grounded adulthood, but to a Christian adulthood marked by an intentional effort to bring one's life in line with the greater narrative of the Christian faith.*"

What's missing? I guess that in many instances, we are not ready to let go, we hold on hard to the past as if it is our salvation. We hold on to what we didn't accomplish and we hold on to too much of what we can't change. We know about the "transitions" that need to happen in our lives, but we are so comfortable the way things are, why "change." This applies to all aspect of our life. We travel in many directions trying to live the life God has given us, which is the most precious gift we have received, but are we in Transitions?

Most recently, as I was reading some portions from Jeremiah I found out once again, about the call in my life. In addition, how I have to work tirelessly to tear down and to build up, whatever I have done to work on my strengths, forgetting that this is about me becoming a healthy mature disciple of Jesus Christ. What I mean is; we invest so much time, energy, and resources trying to discover our purpose in our disciple journey when we just need to "experience the transitions of our journey."

For us it is time to move from new beginnings into transitions as we journey together. The questions for me and I think for you all is what I'm going to do to move forward in becoming a mature, faithful disciple of Jesus Christ. On the other hand, and where I will place my gifts to help our congregation to move forward in witnessing Christ?

Ash Wednesday is around the corner, maybe instead of thinking about what I should give up, maybe, just maybe this could be a great time to reassess our priorities, redefine our core values and reexamine our responses to the call of God in our lives; living our discipleship here at the SUMC.

Let's learn from the struggles of our siblings in the African-American communities as we celebrate "Black History Month". Our siblings can truly share with us the meaning of "transitions" and journeys of hope and faith.

May God continue guiding us all as we experience the transitions of our journeys!

Celebrating Black History Month

February 4 & 5, '23- "You Are" Fifth Sunday after the Epiphany
Service of Communion

Here again, Jesus asks us to reflect on the power we already have. "You are salt. You are light." Not, "Do you want to be salt, or do you want to be light?" You already are. So, given that declaration from our Lord, how will we season? What will we light up?

Readings: Psalm 112: 1-10 Matthew 5: 13-20

February 11 & 12, '23 - "But I Say" Sixth Sunday after Epiphany
Relationships within the body are important, but so is the relationship of the church with the wider community. How can you lift community concerns or needs in your prayer time? What acts of service within the community are already in place that you can celebrate? What additional needs could be met, or invitations issued? Who is missing from the body of the church? Jesus calls us to go above and beyond in our attempts to see all the people.

Readings: Deuteronomy 30:15-20 Matthew 5:21-37

February 18 & 19, '23- "Super Sunday" Transfiguration Sunday
Transfiguration Sunday, like Reign of Christ or Christ the King Sunday, is about the identity of the one we follow. Jesus the Christ is revealed in glory on the mount of transfiguration. Like the disciples who were privileged to be with him in that moment, we often miss the significance or the opportunity to praise in our struggle to understand. This day is not about knowledge; it is about faith.

Readings: Exodus 24:12-18 Matthew 17:1-9

February 22, '23 - "The Fast We Choose" Ash Wednesday
We live in a world that doesn't particularly enjoy self-examination or facing our own shadows. There is much that would call us to think about life, our potential, and reaching for our dreams, but very little to call us to see ourselves truly and confront those things within us that are destructive. So, Ash Wednesday is not just a day of repentance and solemnity. It is also a day of celebration and possibility - the possibility of life in abundance.

Readings: Joel 2:1-2, 12-17 Psalm 51:1-17 Matthew 6:1-6,16-21

February 25 & 26, '23 - "If You Fall Down" First Sunday in Lent
If we endeavor to work in the world around us, we will fall down. From time to time, we will fail; our efforts will not be received in the spirit intended; the fruit will be slow in coming. So, if we must fall, let us fall down in worship of the one who redeems us.

Readings: Romans 5:12-19 Matthew 4:1-11

SCHOLARSHIPS

The Memorial Committee will be offering scholarships to deserving and qualified students planning to attend a 2 or 4-year-college or university next year.

- One or more \$500 scholarships will be awarded from the **Church Scholarship Funds**. The number of scholarships vary each year and are determined by the amount of money in the scholarship fund at the time the applications are reviewed in April. Contributions to this fund can be made at any time during the year.
- The \$1,000 **Marion B. Marsh Memorial Scholarship** will be given to a person entering the freshman year.
- The **Barbara J. Rodgers Memorial Scholarship** of with a minimum of \$1,000 and a maximum of \$5,000 will be given to a full-time student who has completed the freshman year and is planning to continue his/her undergraduate, graduate, or post-graduate studies at an accredited college or university, majoring in a religious vocation or education vocation. Priority will be given to a prior recipient of the Barbara J. Rodgers Memorial Scholarship. If no applicant meets the criteria, the scholarship will not be awarded.
- The **Midge Hartsuch Memorial Scholarship** of \$500 will be given to a student who will be attending Kishwaukee Community College in Malta. If no applicant meets the criteria, the scholarship will not be awarded.
- The **Karen S. Palm-Hale-Hagen Nursing Memorial United Methodist Endowed Scholarship**, based on funds in the account, with the minimum of \$500 will be awarded to one high school senior declaring "Nursing" as their college major or an active college student pursuing a nursing degree each year for their dedication to serving others in the surrounding Sycamore/DeKalb communities. If no applicant meets the criteria, the scholarship will not be awarded. **(NOTE: The criteria and application for this scholarship is different from the Sycamore United Methodist Church Scholarship criteria and application.)**

Applications and criteria are available in the church office and online at www.sycamoreumc.org. The application needs to be completed and returned to the church office by March 31, 2023. Be sure to use the 2023 scholarship applications to be considered for a scholarship. The scholarships will be awarded in June. If you have questions, please contact Diane McQueen at 815-899-8878.





This was shared with me recently by a fellow church member on Facebook. Good food for thought...

I Go to Sing

I might be exhausted, and the children might be cranky, but I will be going to church on Sunday. Don't know who is preaching, doesn't matter –the sermon may be helpful or not, holds my attention or doesn't –it's the singing. I go to sing.

I get up, get clean, get dressed, possibly get mad (at not-ready kids, at empty coffee pot, at traffic) get going, get there, get seated, get comfortable, get focused and when the music starts, get saved. It's the singing. I go to sing.

It's the willingness to stand if you are able, the common agreement on page number, the voluntary sharing of songbooks with people on your row, even ones you rode there with –but most of all, it's the collective in-breath before the first sound is made, the collective drawing upon the grace of God, the collective, if inadvertent, admission that we are all human, all fragile, all in need of the sustaining air, freely dispensed, all in need of each other to get the key right and not sound discordant —

it's the hidden life-celebration in the act of making a joyful noise, All together .We don't even have to sound that good. Singing together still brings home the WE-ness of worship, the not-alone-ness of life in God...the best of all we have to offer each other.

When we are singing, I think that I might actually be able to forgive you for being so terribly human, and you might be able to forgive me for being so terribly human too, and we might be able to find peace now, not postpone it for some heavenly hereafter but live and breathe it today, drawing in the grace of God, voicing out our need and hope and gratitude and longing.

When we are singing, I can feel the better world coming, and if I get to be a part of it, you do too . . .

so sing with me, and we'll make our way down that blessed road together, collectively better than we ever thought possible.

DESTINATION: DISCIPLESHIP!



“But WHY???!?” This question evokes that tone in a child’s voice as they yearn for a greater understanding of what’s before them. How many of us were met with the response: “Because I said so!”

Why should we grow in our faith and make more disciples? Because Jesus said so! Jesus says in Matthew 28:19-20: “Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to obey everything that I’ve commanded you.”

CONGREGATIONAL CARE & OUTREACH

On Saturday, January 14, 2023, the entire church leadership team met for a training session. A new part of this team met for the first time: The Congregational Care and Outreach Ministries Committee. This committee is made up of members of current outreach committees and the Caring Ministries Network as well as members from the congregation including those from the UMM and UWF. This committee will meet every other month and function and serve as a coordinating group between their committees/groups and the rest of the ministries of the church such as Discipleship and Worship.

A newly formed group within the Congregational Care and Outreach ministry is the Great Commission Team.

Matthew 28:19–20: Jesus said, “All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world.”

Although this team will not be directly baptizing anyone, they will be doing their best to help grow this awesome congregation.

The group will be tasked with two important tasks:

1. Contact any member that has not been in worship in the last 90 days. How are they and their families doing?
2. First-time visitors – This group will ensure that visitors are greeted and conduct a follow-up contact to answer any questions. 1st time visitors have attended worship here for a reason. We want to talk with them and possibly meet that expectation.

All these contacts will be made low-key and as unobtrusively as possible. We want to help folks with any spiritual needs and ensure they are as comfortable as possible attending worship at our church. We are all children of God.
