

Sunday, April 2 – Palm/Passion Sunday

"This is the day that the Lord has made. For us. Because of us. It could be argued that out of all these high and holy days, this one is the most ... human. "Well, of course," you might think. This week is a divine and human encounter; in fact, we might argue it is THE divine and human encounter. This is true; but hear me out. This day, this slash day, this Palm/Passion Day is the most human day of this whole event."

Thursday, April 6 – Maundy/Holy Thursday

"I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you should also love one another" (John 13:34 NRSV). This means that part of what we need to do here is to help people understand what this kind of love means. When Jesus says, "as I have loved you," he is pointing back to the washing of the disciples' feet. The command is to serve in loving ways. This isn't about an emotion or a feeling toward others; it is an act that we can perform.

Friday, April 7 – Good Friday

A Christianity that is about nothing more than a guarantee of personal forgiveness and a life of eternal bliss is the antithesis of what Christ came to do – it is selfish, escapist and unloving. It removes us from any cost and deceives us into believing that all we have to do is agree to a set of ideas and sit back until we get to heaven. Good Friday does not leave us with this delusion, however. Jesus confronts selfishness and self-protectiveness at every turn.

Saturday, April 8- Easter Vigil

If resurrection is just about a miraculous event that happened to Jesus long ago, or if it's only about something that happens to some people at the end of time, then it has little real value, no matter how fascinating it may be. But, of course, resurrection is about far more than this. It's the promise of God's life available to us both now and forever. And it is the call for us to follow Christ by becoming life-givers and agents of resurrection in our families, communities, and our world. What a glorious and miraculous challenge!

WORDS FROM OUR PASTOR

Friends in Christ,



Many of us long to burst outside after the unusually and unpredictable winter. In few weeks spring will arrive and Easter is around the corner, yet the turn of seasons has not overwhelmed us with expected warmth. Finally, the grass and trees soon will be awakened from their cold-lengthened slumber and the landscape will be looking greened very soon. And soon we will be awakening with sounds some announcing the new season, others letting us know that winter is over.

What awakens you? What sounds do you hear? What might alert you to the joy of new life in our midst? In few weeks is the awakening moment of our Christian faith. Christmas may be the sentimental season which warms our spirits in the middle of winter, but Holy Week and Easter are the moments in our faith calendar which wring us through the angst, pain and death of Christ and spits us out in front of the empty tomb. It ought to wrench our faith out of its comfort zone and stir our hope and imagination. Holy Week should shake us to the core with its drama, its import and its resurrecting result. The power and might of God are at no time more evident than in that week. Christian author Annie Dillard writes: "It is madness to wear ladies' straw hats and velvet hats to church; we should all be wearing crash helmets. Ushers should issue life preservers and signal flares; they should lash us to our pews". (Annie Dillard in Teaching a Stone to Talk). Dillard has captured the power of Holy Week, in fact the resurrection drama and worship we celebrate every Sunday.



As we journey, the month of April reminds us that Easter is *more than just one day*. Easter is an "every Sunday" celebration during which we come together to receive the fruit of the cross and resurrection of Jesus—the forgiveness of sins and the certainty of eternal life with God. Easter is also an "every day" celebration in which we live each day trusting in God through Christ, knowing that Jesus is "the resurrection and the life" (Jn 11:25) for us.

So what do we do now as we go forth from the empty tomb? Let us follow the example of the first witnesses of the empty tomb. After the two angels reminded Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women that Jesus had risen, Luke tells us that "they remembered the words, and returning from the tomb they told all these things to the eleven and to all the rest" (Lk 24:8-9), emphasis nine). They went forth from the tomb changed by the resurrection of Jesus. They went forth from the tomb to bring an "every day" witness of God's power death. So where do we go once, we leave the empty tomb? Let us follow the example of Jesus' first disciples. After Jesus walked through locked doors to appear to the eleven disciples and to show himself to Thomas, seven of the eleven disciples went back to their fishing business (Jn 21:1-14). They went back to their vocations or stations in life and took the witness of the resurrection with them. They lived in the joy of the resurrection of Jesus while carrying out the daily, ordinary labor and responsibilities given to them.

Similar to the women at the empty tomb and the eleven disciples, we are "every day" witnesses and participants in the resurrection of Jesus. We believe! We have the hope of eternal life. We have the joy of the resurrection *living* inside of us. Also, like the women at the empty tomb and the eleven disciples, we have vocations or stations in life that God has given to us as gift. Most of us are not fisherpersons, but all of us have one or more



of these callings: spouses, parents, sons, daughters, brothers, sisters, grandparents, employees, retirees, friends, and neighbor. Each of these callings comes with a set of duties and responsibilities. As Easter People, by God's grace we wrap the daily duties and responsibilities of our vocations in the joy, love, peace, and forgiveness of Christ. And, more than likely, others will take notice and God will bless your faithful work by giving you opportunities to "tell all these things to all the rest" (Lk 24:9).



REFUGEE GOOD NEIGHBOR TEAM

Our 2 families are doing well, each are adjusting to their new life in different stages.

The Somali family are having a bit of culture shock, as the 5 women had lived most, if not all their lives in refugee camps in Africa. America is a totally new experience for them, such as shopping in grocery stores or a Target, can create a few challenges. Things we take for granted, like putting on seat belts or opening doors is new to them! Our team is helping them as best they can. They have been helped with finding a more cost affective cell phone plan, trips to grocery stores, and the resale shops to find items either free or for little cost. The have taken English classes provided by World Relief. They have their Social Security numbers and state id's and several have begun working. The youngest is in school. Establishing friendships has been difficult because of the language barrier. We have faith as time goes on things will improve.

The Venezuelan family are adjusting much quicker. The children are really enjoying school and friend-ships being made. All 4 members of the family have their Social Security cards and state id's. The parents will be interviewing for jobs soon. Both parents are taking English classes through World Relief and we see improvement. Our team has taken turns taking them to lunch when we visit. They like trying the different foods available.

We had a special Sunday with the Osto Yrtiago family when we brought them out to attend worship at SUMC. They were warmly welcomed by all and Pastor Luis especially made the effort by speaking in Spanish several times during the service. They were brought to the altar so the congregation could pray for them. After the service, Katie and Cliff Lo hosted a lunch for the family, Pastor Luis and Norma and team members. A fun time was had by all.

Happy news was shared with Helen Maurer from a previous refugee family, Jolie and her husband welcomed a new baby boy, Shema Joshua.

SPIRITUAL GIFTS

Relationships. That's why we're all members of the Sycamore United Methodist Church. We're on a journey of relationships. There are signposts along this "journey of" that I'd like to discuss with you.

Signpost #1: Only Paul talks about spiritual gifts. The Greek word he uses is *charis* which means "grace," with the plural of that being *charismata*. This reminds us that all these are gifts from God. I think of them as "grace gifts" — unmerited blessings and undeserved gifts freely bestowed upon us to help us grow in our relationship with God and our call to discipleship and ministry. We can take no credit for these "grace gifts." They are solely from our triune God. They are the first equipping tool God gives us.

Signpost #2: Grace gifts are granted for two reasons – one being personal and the other being community. Personally, grace gifts enable us to serve God using these gifts. On the community side, these gifts allow us to work for the common good, to band together with others to better our congregation and the community in which we live. Along with prevenient grace, I believe God has already placed in each community of faith – the grace gifts, skills, passions, and experience necessary for the community to partner together enhancing our relationships with God.

Signpost #3: Discernment of God's call to us? There are only three constants in life – death, taxes, and change. Our spiritual grace gifts are constantly changing as we, in different stages of our lives, attempt to discern God's will for us. It's never static. There are times when the call is clear and precise - the two by four right between the eyes. There are also times when we struggle for clarity and direction as God whispers to us. We wonder if God is withholding discernment from us. These times hold unique opportunities for us to see how God has equipped us in a variety of ways to fulfill that call. God is always doing something, whether offering discernment or using that time to prepare us for what is to come. These are the times when we need to put our spiritual gifts to work to remind us of our constant connection to God.

Signpost #4: Love is the universal spiritual gift. If you ever feel the need to understand what love is all about, reread 1 Corinthians 13. Paul lays it out for us. He makes it clear that all our spiritual gifts are nothing without first having Love. Paul uses the term agape – the Greek working meaning "unconditional love." It is agape love that God has for us. God calls us to express a godly love towards others for the common good. Our grace gifts are given to us for the express purpose of doing just that. God has demonstrated unconditional love for us and calls for us in turn to demonstrate unconditional love towards others - all our neighbors, all the time.

DESTINATION: DISCIPLESHIP!



Spring brings new life and things are sprouting here at SUMC. Our Visioning Team is working tirelessly to determine our five core values and create a new mission & belief statement. The newly formed Discipleship Team is hard at work developing language and an Intentional Discipleship System (IDS) to help determine how we are growing in our faith as individuals and as a congregation. In the coming months, you will hear more about this process as it evolves.

You will also hear new language springing into conversations that has been carefully chosen to make discipleship more accessible and remind us that spiritual formation is a lifelong pursuit. So, I thought it helpful to pull on my teaching roots with a mini glossary.

Here are some terms you might hear:

- 1.Children's Education = Children's Spiritual Formation
- 2.Adult Education = Adult Spiritual Formation
- 3.Member = Disciple

We have identified three areas that the Discipleship Team will focus on to help us blossom. Small groups will be formed to help support and sustain each other in our journey of faith. Adult Spiritual Formation will facilitate programs and events to expand our understanding of God and spiritual practices. And Children's Spiritual Formation will focus on developing ways for kids to tap into their inherent capacity to connect with God and one another.

While change can be challenging, we know that God is in **ALL** things working for good. God is in Lent, the time we remember that Jesus wandered in the wilderness for 40 days and nights. God is in the crucifixion that granted forgiveness to us all. And God is present in the resurrection that happens not only on Easter, but in those resurrection moments to remind us that HOPE SPRINGS ETERNAL with the rising of our brother, our Redeemer, Jesus Christ. May those moments flourish in this new season of our year, our lives, and our church.
