Friends,

If I went up to heaven, you would be there.

If I went down to the grave, you would be there too! Psalm 139:8

"...and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth"

Acts 1:8

It is easy to be grateful for good times. When the sun is shining, flowers blooming and birds singing, it's easy to give thanks.

On the other hand, it's not easy to be grateful when it's raining, and we must carry a load of groceries into the house.

It takes special effort to give thanks for tough times as well as good, for setbacks as well as successes, for weakness as well as strength.

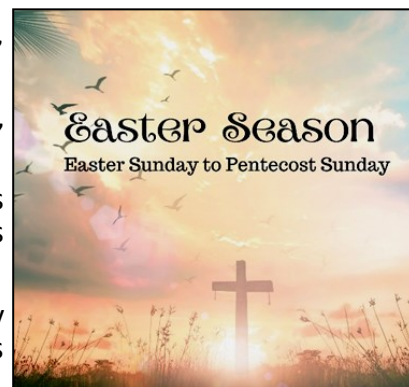

Contrary, the call, the invitation, the challenge is to be witnesses of Christ' Resurrection. It does not specify how (maybe that's what we think), or when, however it to be done everywhere. It doesn't say, wait until you are ready, equipped, prepared. The first witnesses of the Resurrection were confused, amazed, scared of what had happened to Jesus' body. They were not ready or prepared for what they found. The Women ran back to the disciples and shared what they saw. Under no circumstance were they worried about others' perception or opinions of them, they just witnessed. And then we became Pentecost People, people empowered by God's Spirit to humbly respond to the invitation. Now there are no excuses, we always will have one. Looking ahead for what is left of the Easter Season, let's see if we can look at every experience that has brought us to where we are now and trust that we have never been apart from God. God's providential care has been with us all along. Let's carry on.

LECTIONARY READINGS FOR MAY

Sunday, May 7, 23- Fifth Sunday of Easter

One of the biggest questions we must face as followers of Christ is that of how our faith interacts with the crises in our world, and our engagement with them. It can be tough to walk the line between faith as an escape that makes us feel safe by "protecting" us from the world's problems, and faith as little more than a framework for directing our own efforts to fix things. The third way – that of participating in God's saving work while simultaneously trusting God for the outcome in our lives and world – is not always easy to live.

Readings

Acts 7:55-60 & John 14:1-14

Sunday, May 14, 23- Sixth Sunday of Easter

In the light of the huge struggles we face in the world today, it can be tough to speak about God's presence, especially when we seek to affirm God's presence with those who suffer. But, the readings all call us to embrace the reality that God is with us even in the dark times, and that it is in God that we all "live, move and have our being" – whoever we may be.

Readings

Acts 17:22-31 & John 14:15-21

Sunday, May 21, 23- The Ascension of the Lord (Seventh Sunday of Easter) Confirmation Sunday

The Ascension is one of those significant days in the Liturgical Calendar. There is so much meaning, so many ways of approaching the readings and yet it remains a day of celebration and an invitation to deeper encounter with God.

Readings

Acts 1:1-11 & Luke 24:44-53

Sunday, May 28, 23 – Day of Pentecost (Summertime Worship)

Sometimes it feels like the celebration of Pentecost has become an exercise in missing the point. What was a radical, communal, inclusive, and world-shifting event has become, in much contemporary practice, and individualist, exclusive, status-quo sustaining experience with little more to commend it than a sense of euphoria. If only we could recapture some of the Church-birthing impact of this significant day, both the Church and the world around it would, like the Pentecost spectators, be amazed by what God is doing among us.

May the Spirit of Pentecost disturb, challenge, and empower us!

Numbers 11:24-30 & John 7:37-39 (John 20: 19-23)

STEWARDSHIP IN ACTION

ARE WE WILLING TO SACRIFICE?

We have celebrated Easter. A reminder of what real sacrifice looks like and the promise of a new life filled with hope today, not in the far distant future. We are called to take the life examples of Jesus and be his disciples, becoming a living example for others to see and follow. Author and Pastor Michel Piazza asks the question "What will your sacrifice be?"

Rev. Piazza suggests we take a look at our calendars, our bank accounts, and our debts. Are we overscheduled, overdrawn, and spending ourselves into debt for stuff that really doesn't matter? How often do you think that your garage, your basement, or your attic is so full of stuff you might have to rent a storage unit to hold the overflow. Doing some serious Spring cleaning and donating the excess to charity is a start.

Rev. Piazza offers a further suggestion by introducing the concept of "Enough." Instead of overconsumption on material things, try redirecting your energies in a different way. Rather than overspend or overextend, Rev. Piazza says try the simple act of deliberately doing kindness each day for someone who cannot repay you. Add time to spend with your children, a friend, or a neighbor to give moral and spiritual support (and helping them with a project is an added bonus). And take time for yourself by going to an extra church service, bible study, or group meeting to grow your own spirituality.

As you reevaluate your priorities and make your sacrifice, think of these words from 2 Peter 1:3, "His divine power has given us everything we need for a godly life through our knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness." 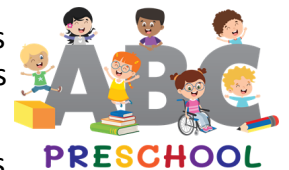

UPDATES TO RESOURCE AND WELCOME CENTERS



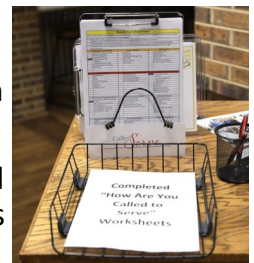
I hope everyone enjoyed the Holy Week events and worship services here at the Sycamore United Methodist Church. I certainly did - especially the Easter Cantata. It was awesome. What a story it told!

I hope you have seen some of the updates to the Concourse with the Welcome Center and the Resource Center. (See Picture 1) The staff, with input from the congregation, has come up with a list of discipleship and service opportunities - the "How Are You Called to Serve?" worksheet. The goal is to provide every church member with a list of opportunities and their descriptions to grow in faith through the service of church and neighbor.

The process of identifying your service opportunity is simple:

A worksheet that lists the opportunities available for service to the different church ministries is on a clipboard that is on top of the Welcome Center. (See Picture 2)

For example, listed under *Outreach Ministries* are opportunities to serve in our Food Pantry, Coat Ministry, Good Neighbor Refugee Team, and to support DeKalb County's Hope Haven shelter, Meals on Wheels, and the Safe Passage shelter.



The Resource Center is divided into 12 cubbies. Each cubby contains a basket. Most of these baskets contain folders with detailed descriptions, time requirements, and which church staffer to contact for more information on each ministry area. (See Picture 3)

Stop by when you are in the Concourse and have a look. If you find an opportunity that fits your talents, availability, and interests, select the item or items on the worksheet, fill in your name and contact information on the bottom, and leave it in the designated basket. The appropriate church staff member or committee member will then contact you.

Please understand that this is just the initial service opportunity worksheet. We look forward to developing ways to support this congregation in its spiritual growth as we get feedback from each of you. If you have an idea or project in mind, find a church staffer and share your thoughts.

Just think about how much this church could accomplish and contribute to our community if each one of us volunteered for our "just right" opportunity to serve! Wow!

- **Adult Worship Reflection:** looks at the week’s text, discusses the sermon, and the next steps to live out our mission.
- **Youth Worship Reflections:** for MS and HS Youth
- **Prayer Band:** will gather 8-10 people to pray for the needs of people in this church, the community, and the world.
- **Topics on Discipleship:** offers special programming on a weekly basis to explore different areas to enrich our understanding being a disciple who transforms the world.

REFUGEE GOOD NEIGHBOR TEAM

We continue our weekly and sometimes extra visits with our families from Somalia and Venezuela. Both teams are enjoying getting to know and help the families.

Small advances in the Somali women becoming more trusting and outgoing with the team are being seen. One visit included a game of Jenga, which was the first time for this family and the team to engage in a fun activity. The younger girls are shy with our team members and seem to like to stay in their room and enjoy the companionship of each other. Team reports they can hear laughter coming from the girls, which is never a bad thing. The eldest daughter, Hamido was helped with learning how to navigate English class online, which she takes via Zoom. Asha (the mother) was taken to a clinic to get medicine for an eye appointment. Daughter ZamZam was taken to a bank and was helped with opening up a checking account. Trips to grocery stores were made. We hear them tell of visiting friends in Chicago. On April 21, the last day of Ramadan they went to the mosque with friends visiting from Somalia and prayed for 3 hours. We are looking forward to better weather days, so that the team can take them for walks to the various parks in Aurora.



Our friends from Venezuela, the Osti Yrtiagos are doing very well. Luis and Lisbeth both got jobs. Luis with Berry Global (a plastics factory) and Lisbeth with Hello Fresh! Luis began his 6 week training for his position as a packaging machine technician. This position is a promotion from the first position he was offered, as a fork lift driver. We are happy that his varied skills have been recognized and being used. The promotion included a pay increase and bonus! Lisbeth will begin her job after Luis finishes his training, as someone needs to be home to make sure the children get to school and back home. Hello Fresh! is a meal home delivery service. Lisbeth will be working in the area of meal preparation, which is something she was interested in, a job using her cooking skills.

Son Fernando is doing well in school and making friends. He is now on a soccer team with West Aurora high school. Cliff and Katie Lo's 2 sons have played soccer with Fernando and they say he is very good! Daughter Ari has opened up with team members and has gotten to enjoy our visits. We get big smiles and even hugs from her now. She loves school and has made friends.

Lisbeth found out that Vance's birthday was April 9 and wanted to have a party for him. We arranged for the family to come out to Sycamore and a pizza party was held at the Lo's. Lisbeth made Vance a flan for his birthday, along with a layered jello dessert. Both were delicious and it's not everyday one can say they were treated to homemade birthday flan.

The family had to leave their cat behind when they came to America. World Relief has been trying to get the cat flown to America, but so far, no luck. The cat, Zoe, is a support cat for Lisbeth and she misses her dearly. So the team decided to gift Lisbeth and family a new cat. The Lo's and Alex went to TAILS on Easter Sunday and via a phone conversation with Lisbeth, a new kitty was chosen. Kitty was taken to the family on Easter Sunday. Astrid is their new cat and she is well loved already.

Several of us enjoyed an evening out together at the World Relief Global Gala this past Friday. It is a fund raising event that included dinner and entertainment. We heard about some of the amazing work that World Relief does and several success stories from refugees. World Relief expects to serve 7,000 refugees this coming year in the Chicago area.
