STEWARDSHIP IN ACTION

AMBITIOUS DISCIPLESHIP AWAITS YOU, ARE YOU READ TO BE ENGAGED?

Ephesians 2:10 says *"For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do."* This is our reminder that we are managers of all of God's creation. As owner, God has called us to be responsible as we fulfill the role for which we have been created, to do his will as long as we remain on earth.

Our financial reporting for the first third of the year shows we are falling short in funding our mission statement which is "to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world." Through April, revenues are at \$214,586.33 while expenses total \$288,940.07. <u>We have a budget deficit of \$74,353.74.</u> The primary reason for this shortfall is due to less dollars being donated than originally estimated when our budget was prepared at the end of last year.



We may feel inadequate and unprepared both physically and financially for the tasks God places before us, but our strength is in the Lord. When taking our membership vows, we pledge to support our church with our time, talents, and treasures. This is why we:

- Take part in Bible Studies, Sunday School, and the ABC pre-school.
- Travel on youth and adult mission trips to help people we've never met.
- Visit seniors, shut-ins, and the sick.
- Help to feed the hungry through the food pantry.
- Provide support for recently arrived refugee families from other lands.
- Participate in worship with music, voice, and our presence.

These works are sustained by your gifts. Thank you for what you have already contributed. But please prayerfully consider your financial support for the Missions and Ministry of our church and what more you can do. Be fully engaged in ambitious discipleship at Sycamore United Methodist Church. VISIONING TEAM UPDATE



Discovering God's Future for Your Church

The SUMC Visioning Team continues to meet every first and third Thursday of the month to develop the new SUMC Mission Statement and Core Values. Recently, team members presented the proposed Mission Statement and Core Values to the Church Council, which were unanimously approved by the council members.

Using primarily the information gained from the congregational survey that was completed last fall, the new Mission Statement combines the prior Vision and Mission statements. The first portion now matches the General United Methodist Church's mission by adding "for the transformation of the world," and retains the Gather-Grow-Serve attrib-

utes – with a few wording tweaks – that we have had in use since the time when the last Mission Statement was implemented.

Our Mission is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

- We GATHER together to worship God.
- We GROW in faith and love of Jesus Christ.
- We SERVE the church, community, and world, by the power of the Holy Spirit.

To support the Mission Statement, five new Core Values have also been created:

- Community: Strengthening relationships within our congregation and developing relationships with our neighbors.
- Discipleship: Growing in faith intentionally through worship, giving, study, and acts of service.
- Faith: Developing and affirming a personal belief in God and allowing one's life to be transformed.
- Integrity: Adhering to honesty and transparency, even when it's difficult.
- Love: Loving God and sharing God's love through acceptance, inclusion, empathy, and forgiveness.

Now, the Visioning Team is working on the "marketing" of the Mission Statement and the Core Values. The team has been divided into 6 sub-teams, with each sub-team developing various ways to present the respective topics to the congregation. The potential methods we are evaluating to use for presenting to the congregation include videos, posters, bookmarks, pew cards, shirts, etc. Look for the presence of these various communications media in the weeks and months ahead.

Speaking of the church survey: Recently, the Visioning Team was reminded that while we have been scrubbing the results of the survey and using them in our development of the Mission Statement and Core Values, we realized that we have not yet shared the results of the survey with the congregation; this omission is not intentional, and we apologize for not recognizing this gap before now.

As you may know, 225 congregants completed the survey, and over three dozen pages of results and comments have been documented from the survey. On the positive side, the 3 areas which received the overall highest satisfaction results (ratings of Good or Outstanding) were: Worship (88%); Music (84%); and Youth/LIFE Missions (76%). Conversely, the 3 areas identified with the most opportunities for improvement (ratings of Poor or Adequate) were: Finances (26%); Adult Education (21%); and Outreach Ministries (20%). As we continue to complete the final tasks involved in our team's mission, we will also look to develop a concise summary of all of the results of the survey that the congregation can read without having to "mine through" all the separate pages of data.
