Focus: Self-Awareness


Making ourselves ready for the table focusing on creating healthy bodies, healthy minds, & healthy spirits

Learning to create a safe space through communication, communion & commitment. Understanding our seat at the table, creating space for all, & inviting others to the table.


This will then lead into 2 subsequent programming themes for 2024-2025 and 2025-2026
