A Message from Pastor Hannah

He told another parable to them: "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that someone took and planted in his field. It's the smallest of all seeds. But when it's grown, it's the largest of all vegetable plants. It becomes a tree so that the birds in the sky come and nest in its branches."

He told them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like yeast, which a woman took and hid in a bushel of wheat flour until the yeast had worked its way through all the dough." -Matt. 13:31-33

These two parables are the first texts I ever preached on. I had just turned 21 and was interning for the faith community I belonged to at the time, Open Worship, which was one of the contemporary services at First United Methodist Church of Denton in Denton, Texas, where I went to college. We were wrapping up a series on love (groundbreaking, I know) and I had been offered the final week in the series. I decided to preach on how love leads to growth—specifically, how the love of this beautiful community I'd belonged to for a couple of years at that point had brought about my own growth, calling me into relationship with Christ and supporting my call to ministry when it became apparent that I did, in fact, have one.

I hadn't started seminary yet, but I'd learned a lot watching our wonderful pastor over the years, and since I was studying both English and German literature, I'd gotten pretty good at writing about the things I read. I'd also been reading theology books "for fun" for a bit at this point (a habit that I dearly hope will return now that I have finished seminary, which pretty much killed it), so I at least had a place to start. I interpreted these parables as illustrations of that ordinary miracle, explaining that both the yeast and the mustard seed represented what theologian Bruce Bauer called "the unholy everyday" to the original listeners. I'd loved these texts ever since I first encountered Bauer's interpretations and knew that these images were worth sharing.

But I had something to add to that interpretation: I imagined God's love as the water poured out on the mustard seed and mixed into the leavened flour, enabling the seed to grow and the dough to come together and rise.

The kingdom of heaven: a home, a loaf of bread, growing eternally in our midst through the grace of God, inviting all of us in.

It was a relatively easy sermon to write, honestly. Easy and fun. The preaching part was another matter. I've struggled with anxiety for as long as I can remember and have long had terrible stage fright as a result. I was so nervous leading up to that Sunday—who was I to think that I had anything to offer these people? How could my humble, untrained words possibly be good enough?

Finally it was Sunday morning. After a few songs, our pastor, Jonathan, introduced me and I climbed onto the stage, blinking in the bright lights, as my friends and loved ones in the congregation cheered me on. My hands shook as I adjusted the music stand we treated as a pulpit. I felt like I was outside my body, watching someone else. Somehow, I took a deep breath and began.

And everything changed. To this day I can't explain it. All I know is that my fear melted away and that I knew, suddenly, that what I had to offer was, in fact, enough. The only explanation I can give is that the Spirit of God was with me in that moment, holding me, guiding me, pushing me to grow. And I knew then that I was in the right place, doing the right thing.

And that I was going to have to keep doing it.

I graduated from UNT that spring. One of my closest friends from church, Jenny, gifted me with a mustard seed pendant, in honor of my first sermon. I wore it basically every day for a long time, but lost it sometime before we moved to Illinois. Fast forward a few years to coming to Sycamore and meeting the team here. When Becca came over to help us with unpacking at the parsonage, I noticed that she wore a mustard seed pendant not unlike the one I'd lost. I quickly told her the story, lamenting that I'd lost my own.

Two weeks later, she presented me with a new one, beautifully carved in a sunflower-like shape with the seed at its center. You might've seen me wearing it; I've worn it every day since, including the first Sunday I preached here. And it felt like coming home.

I look forward to sharing more of my story with this wonderful community—and hope to hear more of yours (you, reading this!) soon.
