What in the World is a Pastor of Congregational Care?

Hi! Pastor MaryLou here! Yes, I'm back, temporarily, to handle pastoral care concerns. The hope is that Pastor Luis can settle in without as many interruptions if I handle hospital and home visits temporarily.

I thought had penned my last missive for The Messenger in May 2021. God had other plans! In that May 2021issue, I lifted up a few senior-friendly services that SUMC was blessed to offer, such as:



- the **Parking Ministry Cards that** persons needing a little extra time getting themselves or someone in their party into the sanctuary can wave to get help from the ushers;
- the Rides to Church program for people who don't drive.
- the Caring Ministry volunteers who make sure people not able to leave their home space share a personal moment of prayer and connection with someone from the congregation.

There are many other forms of **OUTREACH** this congregation brings in Christ's name:

- the **Prayer Patrons Wall** whereby people of all ages pray for individuals on the Life Missions team;
- the Christian Kids who play games with residents of community living facilities like Barb City Manor;
- the **meals** for a few days or several weeks following a hospitalization or illness;
- the funeral lunches where family and friends can share stories and remembrances
- the purses filled with travel sized toiletries for the women at Safe Passage;
- congregants who deliver Meals on Wheels in the name of SUMC, helping us be good neighbors alongside Voluntary Action Center
- cooking and attending meals at NIU's Network of Nations for foreign students
- the **Prayer Shawl Ministry** whose members pray as they knit and crochet items like shawls, hats, gloves, etc., that are distributed as needs arise

Each of the above is a form of Congregational Care. Each of these outreach programs involves individuals and teams of lay persons--not pastors, not staff--using their God-given talents to be God's hands and feet within our congregation and in the wider DeKalb-Sycamore community. They are forms of **OUTREACH** to neighbors, known and unknown. Sometimes they spring up from a grassroots desire to bring God's love to a particular segment of society, like the **Refugee Committee**. Sometimes they start with Children's Education or Life Missions, or UFW or UMM. Sometimes they come from a church committee. **All are rooted in the call to love our neighbor.**

Such efforts are different from the administrative committees like Trustees or Stewardship or Staff-Parish. Those are vitally needed to keep the church operating. Those committees are what permit our congregation to provide the space, resources, funding, and PEOPLE for outreach in Christ's name. They help connect us to the wider Church and the world.

The newly created Minister of Congregational Care will be the lynch pin connecting needs and programs, regardless of age bracket. The Minister of Congregational Care will be the primary point person for initial pastoral contact from SUMC to anyone calling in with a prayer request. That will include hospital and home visits, welcoming newcomers, and, when longer-term needs are identified, connecting the individual or family with CONGREGATIONAL CARE OUTREACH MINISTRIES such as those above that can help tangibly and with prayer.

Know anyone with a love for God and neighbor and top-notch oversight and organizational skills? Let me know ASAP. I've told Pastor Luis I have 3 months to devote to helping get this off the ground and July is already gone!

P.S. No seminary degree required; strong faith and knowledge of the Word, essential!
