## WORDS FROM OUR PASTOR

Beloved,

In Ephesians 3:4-6, Paul makes a big deal about the solving of a mystery and a new revelation from God. What does he say that this is. That God accepts Gentiles, too. Whew! Good news for all we Gentile sorts. God loves us, too.

Maybe we thought we knew this. But it wasn't always clear. There is always a question of how far God's grace extends—of how far God's love goes. In Paul's day, it was whether God's grace extended beyond Israel to the nations (even those who oppressed Israel). Since Paul's day, there is a litany of exceptions that people push forward limiting who God can love and putting boundaries around how God can save.

In his sermon on the "Means of Grace," John Wesley reminds us that the Grace of God is, well, duh, the Grace of God. This grace belongs to God. And like the universe it is constantly expanding. This is tough news for us when we think we have a bead on who God can love or not love. We are constantly be schooled by God in the new and greater ways he can be gracious to us.

Join me, this new year 2022, in opening ourselves to be schooled by God, just like Paul was schooled not only to accept people he had not accepted before, but even becoming their chief advocates.

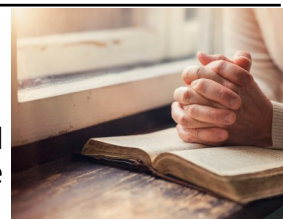

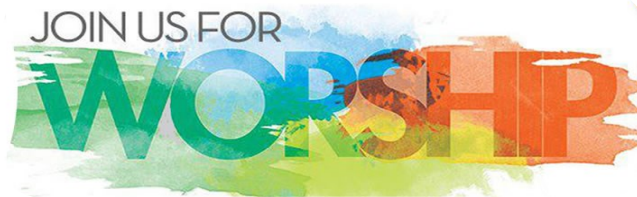

## UNITED METHODIST WOMEN

United Methodist Women participate in the Fellowship of the Least Coin. This is a global ecumenical prayer movement for justice, peace, and reconciliation led by women and girls of all nationalities, ages, educational backgrounds, and social statuses. At circle meetings we collect coins and our treasurer forwards these funds to the International Committee for the Fellowship of the Least Coin located in Canada. This money funds grants for post-secondary education and training for women; grassroots projects that empower women and girls, advocates for their rights, and works to end gender-based violence and poverty. It provides relief in times of natural and human-made disasters. This simple act of our giving is small enough to include everyone and collectively impacts so many in positive ways.

Winter Mission u 2022 might be a perfect fit for you! Women can attend this hybrid (Zoom and in-person) event presented by Northern IL Conference United Methodist Women. It will be held January 21-22 at Christ UMC, 4509 Highcrest Rd. Rockford, IL. Titled "There's Far More Here Than Meets the Eye" offers two classes. Over the holiday team members met with our prior families to gift them with fruit baskets. They shared food with us and caught us up on their lives. . . . which included a new baby, a wedding and baby on the way, and a new job!
