## WORDS FROM OUR PASTOR

March 2 is Ash Wednesday. This will begin the last Lenten Season that I will be leading as your pastor. It will also be the last Lenten season in my ministry as a full time United Methodist clergy. My first U.M. Ash Wednesday was in River Forest as assistant minister in 1974. I remember how strange it was to me, as a Baptist, to receive ashes. Now, 48 years later, Ash Wednesday seems not so much strange, as wondrous. It is a reminder of how often God not only let's us start over, but encourages us to start over. Each time we bump our heads against the realities of life or our own short comings, God graciously calls us to get back on our feet, dust ourselves off (or in this case, put on some ashes), remind ourselves that we are human, and start over. Take advantage of this Grace. Get back on the wagon if you have fallen off; make the change if you're stuck in a rut; say you're sorry, even if it's overdue; forgive others as you would have them forgive you-even if they don't. As the musical group Sweet Honey in the Rock says in the intro to one of their songs, "Make a difference." May this be a transformative Ash Wednesday and Lenten Season for you.

## "Refugee Good Neighbor Team" News

We are off to an amazing start with our two new refugee families from Afghanistan! In our first three weeks of contacts we have partnered with the families to access IL State IDs, get checking accounts, clarify a water bill, apply for LIHEAP (Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program), grocery shop (at international grocery stores!), budget, transport to doctor / dentist appointments, and begin to teach about public transportation to name a few activities. We have been blessed with sharing conversations about their lives in Afghanistan and in Aurora and our lives and families. Their hospitality to us is just lovely. We are greeted with hot tea and plates of nuts and raisins. Often they share an Afghan meal with us after our activity with them. Each of our refugee experiences has been unique over the years and we have learned so much.
Your prayers for our families and team are much needed and appreciated.
I am pleased to report that we have had $\$ 1,500$ donated to World Relief of the $\$ 2,000$ requested. Any additional donations (made to SUMC and notated for World Relief) would be welcome.

I attended a church today where the founding pastor had come out of retirement to temporarily lead the church until they find a new pastor.
The pastor had recently retired to take care of his wife, who suffers from dementia. Although she is still able to attend church, she sits very quietly in service for the most part , with little expression.
This morning during service we stood to sing a congregational song from the red back hymnal, "The old account was settled long ago".

I heard a beautiful alto voice behind me, singing every single word of every verse, beautifully.
When I turned around to see who it was, to my surprise, I discovered it was the pastor's wife - her face with a brightened look, singing every word and every note with confidence, from memory.
With a mind that fails to remember so many things, still the song lives on!
Let me be clear : I am all for a variety of music in our worship services. I don't think that just because a song is not my "cup of tea", that it's sinful. I am all for introducing new songs in our worship, because God is still anointing song writers, and all classic hymns were at one time new songs as well.

With all that said, I STRONGLY BELIEVE that there needs to be a place in our worship services for the old, traditional hymns. Because of their doctrinal integrity, because of their durability, and because there is a generation of saints who have paved the way, paid the bills and kept the church doors open who love them, who are blessed by them, who WANT TO HEAR THEM.


No, you are not going to run all your young people away just because you sing "How great thou art" or "Love lifted me". (You may discover those young people like some of those "golden oldies" as well!)

In our drive to keep our churches current and relevant in this modern day, let's not sacrifice the sacred hymns of the past on the altar of the "cool, hip, and trendy."

I was reminded in a powerful way this morning - there's still life, power and relevance in those precious old songs.

## MISSIONS AND MINISTRIES

## SCHOLARSHIPS

The Memorial Committee will be offering scholarships to deserving and qualified students planning to attend a 2 or 4-year-college or university next year.
One or more $\$ 500$ scholarships will be awarded from the Church Scholarship Funds. The number of scholarships vary each year and are determined by the amount of money in the scholarship fund at the time the applications are reviewed in April. Contributions to this fund can be made at any time during the year.

- The $\$ 1,000$ Marion B. Marsh Memorial Scholarship will be given to a person entering the freshman year.
- The Barbara J. Rodgers Memorial Scholarship of at least $\$ 1,000$ will be given to a full-time student who has completed the freshman year and is planning to continue his/her undergraduate, graduate, or post-graduate studies at an accredited college of university, majoring in a religious vocation or education vocation. Priority will be given to a prior recipient of the Barbara J. Rodgers Memorial Scholarship. If no applicant meets the criteria, the scholarship will not be awarded.
- The Midge Hartsuch Memorial Scholarship of $\$ 500$ will be given to a student who will be attending Kishwaukee Community College in Malta. If no applicant meets the criteria, the scholarship will not be awarded.
- The Karen S. Palm-Hale-Hagen Nursing Memorial United Methodist Endowed Scholarship, based on funds in the account, with the minimum of $\$ 500$ will be awarded to one high school senior declaring "Nursing" as their college major or an active college student pursuing a nursing degree each year for their dedication to serving others in the surrounding Sycamore/DeKalb communities. If no applicant meets the criteria, the scholarship will not be awarded. (NOTE: The criteria and application for this scholarship is different from the Sycamore United Methodist Church Scholarship criteria and application.)
Applications and criteria are available in the church office and on line at www.sycamoreumc.org. The application needs to be completed and returned to the church office by March 31, 2022. Be sure to use the 2022 scholarship applications to be considered for a scholarship. The scholarships will be awarded in June. If you have questions, please contact Diane McQueen at 815-899-8878.

What do you remember about the celebration of Lent in years past? If you have lived as long as I have, you may have a collection of dim memories of Lenten celebrations from years gone by: I remember cardboard coin folders with a slot to add a nickel or dime each day. We punched in our coins, put our name on the front, and proudly marched them up and laid them on the alter sometime during Holy Week. I remember Lenten family devotion books that were supposed to be read around the dinner table; they never seemed to work well with our family. As a pastor, I remember countless Lenten studies, using the latest recommended books from Cokesbury. I remember churches in a community getting together in a rotating basis for a lunch and short worship service each Wednesday noon during Lent. I'm sure I remember the food more than the inspiration of those services. I remember "giving up something for Lent". I usually tried to choose something easy like spinach, but a couple of years I said I was giving up sarcasm...an act of devotion that usually only lasted the first couple of days of the required 40. I remember 24 hour prayer vigils that asked people to sign up for an hour long slot to make sure someone was in the church praying for a 24 hour period. I usually took 2 or 3 o'clock at night. I suppose if I thought about it, there would be other things I could add. Maybe you recall some of these things and can even add others. If so, I would like to hear from you.

This year the Lenten season begins with Ash Wednesday on March $2^{\text {nd }}$. At this point, I am doing a Bible study in Rochelle on the stories Jesus told. Other than that, I have no solid plans, other than forgetting about giving up sarcasm! I suppose that by the time March $2^{\text {nd }}$ gets here, other things will fall into place.
