

WORDS FROM OUR PASTOR

"April Showers Bring May Flowers." Ok. Then what does April winter bring. Snow the day after Easter. Below freezing in the middle of April. Fortunately, we have had better weather since. We may even have a day or two of Spring before Summer starts.

Because early Methodist preachers spent so much time outdoors, travelling from preaching place to preaching place, they thought a lot about the weather. Most accounts that I have read have fairly keen observations about what is going on. A veritable nineteenth century Weather Channel.

In the upper Midwest, the winter of 1832 was especially harsh. Two preachers were travelling to their next appointment. They came to a river that was blocked by ice. They lodged with the local ferryman waiting for a change. When it didn't get better, they convinced the ferryman to row them across, with the two preachers on the bow breaking the ice with long poles. One preacher fell in "about a rod or two from the other shore." The other preacher pulled him out and they finished the crossing.

The soaking wet preacher got on his horse and rode several miles to the next cabin. He was frozen to his horse and unable to speak. The family pried him off and thawed him out. Next morning, he went on his way.

He had several more years of ministry, though he never really recovered. His death was attributed in part to his encounter with the weather.

I have had the occasional hairy escapade with Midwest winters in my time, like the -20 graveside on a windswept hill (everyone but me and the funeral director stayed in their cars) and at least one procession in whiteout. But never anything like what the young preacher experienced.

After all of these years of ministry, I still marvel at what these earlier generations went through. On the other hand, I am grateful for the way that God brings us through the trials and tribulations that happen in our lives, whether weather-related or not. The one thing that I have found in all of these years is the one thing that Wesley testified to on his death bed. "Best of all, God is with us."

We were moved by the outpouring of support from the Congo community in Aurora and World Relief. We estimate 200+ friends supported the family at this funeral event! Team member Katie Lo was inspired to paint a beautiful picture of the sisters which the Lo family delivered to Fiston, Divine, and Divine's family. SUMC members and friends generously donated to Go Fund Me and the church to help with the funeral expenses. The family is very appreciative of your generosity.

We continue to have good experiences with our two families from Afghanistan. They show us You Tube videos of Afghanistan which is interesting for us to learn of their homeland. We hear stories of their concern for family back home and their treatment by the Taliban and lack of job opportunities. Team member Alex Grados has taken the lead on helping 29 year old Sohrab get enrolled for ESL classes at Waubonsee with plans for classwork and a degree once his English is proficient. (Big congratulations to Alex who will soon be graduating from SHS; reaching an educational goal of his own!). Our team is learning about Ramadan, the holy month of fasting, prayer, reflection for the Muslim community. At the end of Ramadan on May 2nd they will celebrate Eid (the festival of breaking the fast) with gift giving, special prayers, and sharing a meal with friends and those in need.
