Friends,

Recently, the Council of Bishops and the Connectional Table of the United Methodist Church (this body functions like a church council in our church, but for the whole UMC) unveiled the church's vision. Along with our mission and core values, we now have key components for a Strategic Plan. This comes after the Staff-Pastor Parish Relations Committee completed Pastor Luis's Ministry Assessment. The committee listed three goals for our congregation—one of them being the development of a strategic plan.

I'm aware we have been here before, but we have learned from our experience in the past. I agree that we need a sense of direction/what direction we must take as we remain committed to continuing the work of building God's Kin-dom.

Susan Beaumont shares, "Strategic planning: in some congregations it's the 'go-to' solution whenever leaders feel stuck. We need to grow. We want more families with young children. We don't know what to do next. Let's plan! But strategic planning is usually a poor choice for getting unstuck. It takes a lot of time and energy—and in many cases postpones action when action is most needed. Strategic planning isn't the right thing to do in every situation. A hasty or poorly formed strategic plan is a waste of time and resources. A well-formed plan that isn't executed is also a waste."

So, what is strategic planning, anyway? Strategic planning is a process that leads to a clear and documented statement of direction for our congregation. It begins with assessing where we are and where we are currently headed. It also involves looking outward at the context in which we do ministry. Myung Sun-Han shares that strategic planning is a Spirit-led process.

He identifies the following key elements in the process:

- Focus the energy forward
- Identify key disparities
- Claim the unique calling of your context
- Acknowledge the movement of the Spirit
- Allow enough time for prayer and discernment

Our mission is to make disciples of Jesus Christ
for the transformation of the world.
We gather together to worship God.
We grow in faith and love of Jesus Christ.
We serve the church, community, and world,
by the power of the Holy Spirit.

To fulfill our mission, we anchor ourselves in the core values of Community, Discipleship, Faith, Integrity, and Love.

At our last Council meeting, we agreed that a strategic plan would provide strong direction for the ministry, mission, and programs of our congregation. We have a good foundation to build upon, picking up where our Vision Team recommendations left us.

Our aim for this strategic plan is to offer guidance and direction to our leadership as we seek to live out our mission. This will be a bold plan that includes many of the hopes, dreams, and aspirations expressed by our staff, leaders, and congregation—some of which were shared during the visioning process.

We are in the early stages of this journey, and we will count on your guidance, wisdom, and commitment to the ministry, mission, and programs of our congregation.

Something special is happening at SUMC to live out our social principles of ministering to people of all abilities. An idea was put forward to both Discipleship & Family Ministries to create a space that extends hospitality to children and adults with differing sensory needs. This idea was brought before the Trustees, who approved the first phase of the project and agreed to support the initial work of clearing and painting to transform the Chapel into this space. A group of nine individuals from the church, staff, and the community have begun the planning process and divided the work into three phases. A complete plan will go before Trustees, Finance, and finalized at the

July Church Council Meeting. All phases will maintain the integrity of the heirloom items should the room be needed as a worship or meeting space. The upgrades will be completed in a timely manner to avoid disruption to the use of the space during Sunday services. The volunteers welcome your prayers as they plan this inclusive space to benefit the families of this church and fill a need for the families in our community.
