




FROM PASTOR LUIS FELIPE'S DESK

Welcome Back to Basics!

The first time I was introduced to our 2025–2026 theme, the image that came to mind was of those enlisted in the Armed Forces preparing for basic training. Along our faith journeys, we too encounter moments where it feels like we are in training—returning to the essentials, learning, stretching, and growing.



The disciples themselves spent nearly three years in intense "basic training" with no less than the Master, Jesus Christ. His teaching centered on the Kin-dom of God here and now, with radical love for all. At times, the disciples struggled to grasp His message, yet Jesus encouraged them that all would become clear in due time. At Pentecost, we are reminded of the Spirit's power, equipping us to be the church Christ calls us to be.

Just as it was for the first disciples, our training is never complete—it is a lifelong journey. Whether you are a long-standing member of our congregation or new to the community, we are all invited to return to the basics together. This fall, we will immerse ourselves in Jesus' parables—stories intentionally told to the disciples and now given to us. From that foundation, He built relationships and discipled others. Likewise, our focus this year is "Back to the Basics"—leaning into simple, everyday practices that shape us as followers of Jesus.

All of our studies and programming will be centered on two practices: **Bible Literacy** and **Prayer.** These are not just disciplines, but lifelines for our walk of faith. By engaging them together, we strengthen our faith and grow closer to God and one another.

As we step into this new season, may we renew our commitment to **Love Boldly, Serve Joyfully, and Lead Courageously.** Look for the many opportunities ahead to learn, connect, and create community as we walk this journey of discipleship together.

STEWARDSHIP IN ACTION - EMPOWERED TO GIVE GENEROUSLY

Being generous does not mean you give the greatest amount. God entrusts each of us with various amounts of time, talents, and treasures. As God's stewards, we are called to manage our blessings according to God's will. God is the source and owner of all things so our goal is to please and honor him with how we use our gifts and blessings to serve others. God knows that that we are not perfect. Since



the fall of Adam, God has used ordinary people to do the extraordinary. Abraham was a man of God, but, when foreigners asked Abraham about his wife, he said that she was only a relative, not his wife. Jacob stole his brother's birthright, Peter denied Jesus, and the disciples quarreled.

In spite of our imperfections and frailties, God wants to use us, just as he did those biblical heroes as his hands and feet to feed the hungry, house the homeless, build his church, and seek the lost with his Gospel. God has made us his stewards, and he equips us for the task. The Apostle Paul wrote, "And God is able to make all grace to you, so that in all things, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work" (2 Corinthians 9:8).

God doesn't expect us to be perfect stewards, but God expects us to have attitudes that meaningfully give in praise and service to him. Small amounts can have a big impact. For example, any given week there are about 200 givers supporting our church. By giving \$20 a week for a year, our narrative budget shows just over \$200,000 needed for nursery school through adult programming (Discipleship and Spiritual Formation) would be fully funded. This includes things like Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, and adult bible and book studies. Examples of this kind of generous stewardship is what prompted Jesus to say, "Well done, good and faithful servant" (Matthew 24:23).
